WELCOME

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hat makes a good golf resort? You'd like to think I had a vague idea given I put these 68 pages together, wouldn't you? Well, the categories, and weighting of them, tells you what I think, and especially that I don't want a replica of the continental Courses Top 100 or anything with a dormy house.

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I want to reward resorts that excel with accommodation. I want to identify the resorts that have the wow factor in terms of setting. And I want to recognise the resorts that have more than just golf, because many of us travel with non-golfers.

You may not agree with those categories, or that they each have 20 percent of the marks, but I'll fight my corner on them.

I am less sure, though, of the precise value of second, third and fourth courses. We recognise them in this ranking, as we always have, but in all honesty the 'extra' courses are probably a little under-valued – possibly because of my uncertainty over how much our readers like having more than one course to play without leaving the resort. And also, what is better, a Top 100-ranked course that is an 8/10 or two 6/10 courses? Are two 7/10 courses more appealing than one 9/10 and a 6/10?

My feeling is the 'extra' courses really appeal to golfers, but I'd be very interested to hear your views – as indeed I would be with the list as a whole.

How the list was compiled

Little has changed in terms of process from 2020. I have been to 90 of the 100 and combined that knowledge with views past and present of my panel: Kevin Brown, Dirk Schaeffer, Joerg Beringer, Olle Dahlgren, Borje and Gunnel Laurinsson. Also, this time I asked the three leading golf holiday operators to assess the list: Golfbreaks, notably David Ford; Your Golf Travel, led by Oliver Gunning; and Golf Escapes' Jon Ruben. I sincerely thank them for their input, an indicator of its value being that a resort came into the 100 because of it.

The criteria we used

We assessed each resort using the same criteria as the 2020 ranking.

Course/s (marked out of 40)

We followed our Top 100 Courses ranking as an initial guide then assessed from there. Extra marks awarded for resorts with more than one course, which means you never having to leave the resort for variety.

Accommodation (out of 20)

Needs little explanation, but... the range and quantity of accommodation on offer was looked on favourably, rather than just 10 incredible rooms.

Setting (out of 20)

Simply, higher marks for a beachside, cliff-

edge or lakeside location. Peaceful countryside gets 15s and 16s, the 'wow' factor get 17s and above. Also, marks taken off if a shuttle is ever required. ۲

Non-golf amenities (out of 20)

The facilities that make a resort appealing to golfers who want to do more than play the game, as well as non-golfers who may be travelling with them.


Finally, what is a resort?

I always state this, because it is important. The course and accommodation have to be part of the same company or group, and have to be on site or within a short transfer. On the occasions where the courses in a resort are spread out a little, the resort receives slightly lower marks in the 'Setting' category.

OK, boring bit over. But I hope lots of you read this, just so you know why resorts you like aren't in (likely because we don't consider them a resort) and also why we use the criteria we do. You'll find a consistency to the list compared to 2020 – as the Up and Down arrows illustrate – but also key moves, not least in the top 20.

I hope the list makes for interesting reading and, more than anything, it inspires and informs your next golf holiday.




Two years ago we said that the addition of not one but two new courses at Costa Navarino would likely make it an

irresistible No.1, and so it has proven. The Greek destination has made steady progress up our Continental Resorts Top

100 to the point, in 2020, when we moved it behind only Terre Blanche. The opening of The International Olympic Academy Golf Course and the Hills, both by Jose Maria Olazabal, gives Costa Navarino 72 holes of high-class golf to add to its immense accommodation and comprehensive amenities. A Greek destination being No.1 in continental Europe would have seemed unlikely 15 years ago, but it is now a reality - and one that feels unlikely to change. Costa Navarino is remote in a golf sense,

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FROM ONE MAN'S DREAM TO EUROPE'S NO.1

How the Greek destination rose to the top of our ranking

Costa Navarino sits on Greece's southern Peloponnese coastline. It is hardly an area synonymous with golf and it would have remained that way had it not been for the vision of one man.

Vassilis Constantakopoulos' working life began as a deckhand and ended with him owning a shipping company and developing the vision for Costa Navarino, with the aim to introduce his homeland

with the aim to introduce his homeland Messinia to the world. Known simply as 'The Captain', Constantakopoulos resolved to harness the beauty of the Messinia area by developing a world-class tourism destination.

His dream became reality 12 years ago, his multi-million euro investment producing two golf courses, the Dunes and the Bay, a destination comprising different resort areas with three luxury hotels – and a fourth to come next year – plus sports and leisure activities.

An array of memorable restaurants – where the gyros in the street café that is where the gyros in the street care that is impossible to ignore at lunch competes with fine dining Mediterranean cuisine in the evening for your favourite dining spot of the week – might well have topped Costa Navarino's seemingly endless list of appealing aspects.

It was instantly one of the continent's most desirable destinations, able to satisfy the requirements of families and couples with little or no interest in the game of golf

as comprehensively as it could those of visiting golf groups. The Dunes has been a regular entry in

our Continental European Courses Top 100. It is a short stroll from the heart of the resort and was designed by Ross McMurray, of European Golf Design, in association with Bernhard Langer.

Large, undulating greens and steepfaced pot bunkers characterise the holes closest to the sea and as you move inland, there is a softer feel to a landscape populated by olive and citrus groves.

The 6,800 mature olive trees that were replanted – some more than 1,000 years old – across the destination's three sites, along with the orange groves, frame the undulating hillside and give the Dunes a seasoned feel.

The Bay course – by Robert Trent Jones Jnr – followed a year later. It is 15 minutes' drive from the first resort in the second resort area, Navarino Bay, and boasts views of the water, from which it takes its name, on all but three holes. It is this aesthetic value that made it No.9 in our Continental Europe X Factor Top 100.

Olazabal's new designs sit more than 200m higher up than the originals, on a plateau – the Navarino Hills – with expansive sea views. The International Olympic Academy Golf Course still has a seaside feel thanks to the panorama across Navarino Bay, but Hills is the destination's first fully inland course. They are both notably longer than Dunes and Bay; The International Olympic Academy Golf Course can stretch to 7,100 yards off tournament tees, the Hills is a meaty 6,800.

The two new courses overlook the villages of Kinigos and Pylos and the Bay of Navarino, famous for its historic sea battle in 1827. They sit on hilly terrain from as low as 150m above sea level to the highest point at 230m.

Navarino Hills offers a mixture of extraordinary sea views and mountain and valley vistas. The International Olympic Academy Golf Course has sea views with the X Factor, while the Hills plays through a valley oozing nature.

The International Olympic Academy Golf Course plays around the western part of the Navarino Hills property and more

than half its holes are laid out along the ridge of the hill that overlooks the bay. The front nine circles the southern portion on softly undulated terrain and leads through old olive groves in typical Greek landscape. The back nine then plays along the edge of the cliff and provides awesome sea views.

Wind can naturally often be a factor given its coastal location, but there is width off the tee to make it playable for all.

The Hills lies on the east of Navarino Hills and journeys past ancient olive trees, rock walls and ravines carved into the Kinigos hills. Only once, on the 4th tee, do you catch a glimpse of the sea, but instead the aesthetic appeal comes from views of unspoiled mountains, valleys and rock formations. Its strength is its balance of strong and strategic holes, as well as its variety; there are dog-legs, uphill and downhill holes, long par 5s, sporty par 4s and exacting short holes.

They will each be contenders for 2023's Continental European Top 100 Courses ranking, when deciding simply the order of the quartet at Costa Navarino will be a tough task in itself.





Two-time Masters champion Olazabal created the new The Olympic Academy Golf Course and The Hills Course at Navarino Bay.

I first went to Costa Navarino around six years ago, when they were looking for a designer for the two new courses planned at Navarino Hills. My team and I all absolutely love the region and we put in our very best effort to win the design job.

My first impressions when I saw the site were simply WOW. The property is spectacular, the views are breathtaking and the characteristics of the site are wonderful for golf. It surely ranks among the most beautiful properties we have ever had the chance to work on.

The views are absolutely stunning, not just across the historic Bay of Navarino but also towards the mountains in the background. This sets the tone for the whole site and gives it a very strong character amidst the garrigue vegetation, which is typical for the Mediterranean. Costa Navarino found an absolute jewel with this property.

I am privileged to have played many of the great golf courses around the world. Courses such as Augusta, the Old Course, and influence you.

the terrain.

Golfers will find the Olympic course to be more polished in style and full of spectacular views across the Bay of Navarino, while the Hills course offers more of a rural feel, where we take you out through the gently rolling hills. The Olympic course has stunning views over Navarino Bay and is the longer and tougher of the two courses. It's more

I am a fan of the classics and am probably more of a traditionalist, but for the new designs we have undertaken, it is the land itself that gives you the inspiration. What is important is how the property sits in its surroundings, what features stand out and how we can model the golf course harmoniously into the terrain so that it feels like a natural fit. Over the past five years, we have worked hard to shape two courses that not only respect the stunning surroundings but that also fit as naturally as possible into

Costa Navarino is already well known around the world but the two new courses will lift it from the status of a golf resort to being a full-on golf destination.

With the new courses and the existing ones, Costa Navarino has developed into a spectacular golf destination, and I invite everyone to go and experience it.

We are spoiled as golfers because there are so many great places to go, but I have said it before and will be happy to repeat it: Costa Navarino is one of the most beautiful places I have ever been to.

It is more than just the golf offering there, it is the whole experience that is exceptional - from the nature, the culture and the people with their amazing hospitality, to the food, the beach and so many activities to choose from.

Don't be surprised if you see me at Costa Navarino from time to time in the future.

Terre Blanche has been our only No.1 since we started ranking resorts eight years ago, so it was going to take something significant to happen to topple it from the top. Costa Navarino's opening of two new


courses to give them four is just that. As it happens, the improved golf that has taken place at our No.3 entry over the page has

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place at our No.3 entry over the page has made the top three a very competitive and tightly-packed trio. They feel a little set apart from the rest, which is saying something given the world-class quality of the rest of the top 10. Why has Terre Blanche been so revered by us for so long? It is an elegant resort with two courses – one in our Continental top 25 – with exquisite village-style accommodation and a wealth of amenities

accommodation and a wealth of amenities for couples, families and groups to enjoy. It enjoys a classic woodland Provencal setting. A long-time worthy No.1 now becomes

the strongest of No.2s.

INTRIGUE ON THE COTE D'AZUR

The fascinating tales behind Terre Blanche

The backstory to one of the world's great golf resorts sounds deliciously like the script for a James Bond film; high-stakes card games, a billionaire entrepreneur, the Cote d'Azur, a French aristocrat imprisoned by Russians... and Sean Connery.

The Terre Blanche story begins in the late 18th century when the estate was acquired by Charles Bouge – the aforementioned aristocrat who was an imperial colonel in the Napoleonic armies and who was taken prisoner by the Russians. It remained in his family for two centuries, until 1979, when Camille Bouge, the then-mayor of the nearby town of Tourrettes, sold the property to Connery.

Legend has it that the most revered 007 won the estate in a game of cards. Connery fell in love with the forest hillside, which is close to where his second wife, Micheline, is from.

The actor began clearing some of the trees required to create the luxury golf resort he had secured planning permission for, but 20 years after acquiring the estate it was sold (via a developer) to billionaire entrepreneur Dietmar Hopp. The founder of software giant SAP and a very keen golfer, had the extraordinary wealth needed to develop the land. The result is one of the world's finest golf resorts.

It is an all-round destination, with the

accommodation and facilities as impressive as the golf. The ambience is one of relaxation, opulence and impeccable service. By way of illustration, cars are not permitted further than the hotel car park, so you hail a buggy to get down to the golf clubhouse.

Hopp handed the task of routing both courses – the Chateau and the Riou – through the hundreds of hectares of hilly forest to the west of Nice to Dave Thomas. The Chateau is the star attraction, routed on often steeply undulating terrain covered in mature trees and shrubs that offer visual pleasure as well as a fragrant aspect to a round.

Expect vast bunkers of white sand, ravines, huge greens, and water features (man-made and natural). Expect a tranquility to your round that makes this 'Millionaire's golf' despite being a thriving resort. Expect flawless conditioning. Expect slick, flawless greens and tees that are as smooth and flat as a marble worktop. And expect a course that consistently asks questions, whether in avoiding drive bunkers and trees off the tee or in holding tiny greens.

The Chateau gets its name from the par-5 6th that begins with a drive towards the castle (the centuries-old Bouge family home) as it peeps out of the ancient oak and pine trees. It concludes with the golfer deciding which of two possible routes they will take to cross the lake.

That is in the Chateau's open phase. The front nine starts and ends in woodland with accompanying picture-postcard views beyond the trees. It feels as if you are in Canada. The scenes are enhanced by the numerous elevated tee shots.

The terrific 10th is played from left to right round the corner of the lake, where only the brave will not have a long club for their approach. It sets up the magnificent 11th and sporty downhill, dog-leg 12th that starts the back nine so magnificently.

Coming home, the best of the par 3s is the last of them. The 16th is played downhill between towering pines over a 'barranca' to a small green framed by a stone wall. It's another spot that screams 'Canada', and is 161 yards of exquisite golf. The expected strong finish arrives with a muscular, uphill par 4 of 450 yards off the tips. It's fairway slopes right to left and it is so easy to find yourself stymied by tree trunks on the low side as you try to thread your approach through what appears a narrow gap between the tall trees round the green – even if you're right in the middle of the fairway.

An exacting climax, but one imagines 007 would have found a way to produce a happy ending and soon after be sipping champagne on the secluded terrace of the chic clubhouse.

There are not too many big moves from the 2020 list, but moving four places in the top 10 is a significant one. It's also very easy to explain.

In 2020, Verdura was dealing with a freak storm that ravaged its golf courses, and we placed it seventh as we were simply guessing about what the golf would be like there in 2021 as Kyle Phillips reworked the 36 holes.

Well, now we know. In our inaugural Italy Courses ranking (issue 428), the East was No.1 and the West was No.5. The East is now better than either of the original courses and a certainty for a prominent slot in next year's Continental Courses Top 100.

Off the course, the quality has been constant.



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Getting there Palermo is 50 minutes away.

The 168-room Sir Rocco Forte hotel is laid out as a succession of one-storey buildings along a path that follows the coastline and you reach it - and that follows the coastline and you reach it – and the rest of the resort – via your retro bicycle. The food is peerless. The active can enjoy beach volleyball, fencing and football with stars such as ex-Juventus striker David Trezeguet. Or yoga, aquatic bodywork, trekking, Pilates and a gym inspired by Sir Rocco himself.

The more indolent can laze by the infinity pool or be pampered in the spa. The icing on the cake is the achingly beautiful white-sand beach just yards from the heart of the resort. A return to the top three for this heavenly

Sicilian seaside resort feels very appropriate.







Expect chic interiors at the Camiral...

This is a brilliant option for groups or couples who want to play plenty of strong golf. PGA Catalunya is Spain's top-ranked resort by virtue of having a strong No.1 course backed up by solid No.2.

Add in two hotels which cater for different budgets – the high-end Camiral plus the less flashy, but eminently desirable Lavida – and you have an extremely wellrounded golf resort.

Where PGA Catalunya misses out, comparative to some other elite resorts, is in the 'Setting' mark, simply because it doesn't have water's edge views at any point. Against which, this truly is a fullycontained resort, so once through the gate, you never need to leave. That, to many, is a real bonus, and we understand why: PGA Catalunya might be the most stress-free of all the multi-course top 10. The Stadium course is ranked in the top 25 in Europe and if you were a betting golfer, you'd say that a round on it would mean you have played a course that will one day host the Ryder Cup. It could have done so already or even next year, but it feels inevitable it will be hosted here eventually.

It is a test of all aspects of your game, with an underrated mix of exacting holes and risk-reward ones. You'll also find it in phenomenally good condition.

The Tour does not let the side down and your rounds on it will not feel like a big drop in standard. The practice facilities, if that is your thing, are absolutely world class.

The Camiral is a handsome, alluring hotel, combining chic interior design with comfort and functionality.

In summary, a break at this resort on the outskirts of Girona will not disappoint.

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Courses 35 Accommodation 18 Amenities 19 Setting 16 TOTAL 88 Getting there Antalya is 30 minutes away.

Carva only falls a place because Verdura has returned to normal. This is Belek's clear No.1 resort - and that is no mean feat.

The golf on offer is exceptionally good; two courses that have become fixtures in our Continental Top 100 in the shape of Carva which is just vards from the hotel - and The National, a short shuttle away.

Then add to the courses the fact you have one of the best hotels in the list by virtue of its modern design, luxurious comfort, and most of all its amenities.

Take your pick from myriad restaurants. a mini water park and numerous pools, a bowling alley, an array of other sports and fabulous add-ons, such as afternoon tea in the most gorgeous little café.

The 'Setting' mark would be higher but for The National being that shuttle ride away - it really isn't a hardship, but we know for some that leaving the resort is understandably a small drawback.

The weather isn't a factor in our assessment in this ranking, but for a yearround destination. Belek's climate makes Carya pretty tough to beat.





Courses **36** Accommodation **16** Amenities 16 Setting 18 TOTAL 86 Getting there Faro airport is 20 minutes away.

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Like Carya, QdL only falls a spot because of the rise of Verdura following its revamp. It's all about the golf here, with three strong 18-hole courses that top pretty much anything in the list. The Magnolia Hotel is a cute, intimate hotel in the heart of the resort, which is

more like a village than a golf resort. QdL do not own the other hotels in the resort but they do own a brand-new sports campus with tennis, cycling, padel and football, plus a selection of six restaurants that might be the best in the 100... which is saying something!

Myself, Jose Maria Olazabal, Miguel Angel Jimenez and many others played in a three-day Pro-Am to launch this new luxury development at

Returning to the resort brought back

Quinta do Lago was the start of my European Tour successes. I had my first win there, back in 1989. I had given myself two years as a professional to see if I could win - if not, I might as well have given up and done something else and got some

It was November 1989, so it was nearing the end of my two-year cycle because I'd started in 1988! Anyway, I managed to win

I remember it so well, even now, more than 30 years on. I led by four going into the last round. It was on the South course. We called it the B&C course at the time, as opposed to the A and D, which was the North course. Now the B&C is the South course and it's probably what many people think is the best of the three very good courses they have there.

Anyway, I started four ahead, I birdied three out of the first four holes and sort of kept going. I felt very relaxed then and I managed to shoot 63, nine under par, and

But your first win, you always remember your first win on the European Tour, or the Volvo Tour as it was back then.

It was always a fantastic place for a tournament and certainly still is. A leading resort in the world, obviously, with the courses, the hotels, the restaurants. The whole facility is first-class, five star in every way.

The North is very playable and you'd probably say the South course is, I hate to say the "tournament course" as such, but it is probably a bit tougher.

So for amateurs the opportunity to play the North course, which is very well designed, is a wise choice. I think it was renovated completely - it was two years off the cycle and it's come back I would say better than ever. Certainly everyone seems to enjoy it and find it 'playable'.

With the Laranjal, which is a very strong 'third' course; they have three really good courses on the same site and it is all very impressive indeed.

The Algarve generally is wonderful, I love it there - fantastic weather and you see the planes coming in with all the golf clubs on board... it's pretty impressive. Two and a half hours from Britain, it's all so easy. So, yeah, I can see why so many golfers see it as a very easy and wise choice.

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A notable rise into the top 10 for this Andalusian paradise, which has only multi-course resorts above it in the list and which sits above many world-class resorts with more than one course.

Finca has 'just' 18 Cabell Robinsondesigned holes, but they're good enough to host the Solheim Cup next year and are manicured to a level surpassed by no other resort in this Top 100. However, even a golf course good

enough to be a fixture in our Continental

Top 100 is arguably overshadowed by the rest of the resort.

The hotel is simply exquisite and is the favourite accommodation of several on the panel. There are amenities ranging from a spa to swimming pools to racquet sports, to restaurants and a Beach Club. The setting, whether in the tranquility of the hills or at that Beach Club, is utterly wonderful. Added to all of this is a level of service that well might be the best in the entire 100.

Finca Cortesin is the finest single-course golf resort in continental Europe. There are only a handful of resorts in the world with one course that come even close to it. In Europe as a whole, only Adare Manor in Ireland is in its class.

If we disregarded second and third courses and resorts and ranked only one course as part of our assessment, it would be hard to imagine Finca would not be No.1.

It's just a lovely, lovely place to be. Sweep through the whitewashed archway entrance, lined by myriad colourful flowers and bushes, and you are guaranteeing a stay of peerless opulence and refinement.

Part of its ability to charm, relax and invigorate is undoubtedly its size. Finca is tiny compared to the other resorts in the top five. Some have hotels with hundreds of rooms and are spread out over a huge area.

Finca is different. There are barely 70 suites here and the distance between your room, the 1st tee, the restaurants and the other facilities must be little more than 600 yards in total.

It gives it an intimacy like nowhere else. Whereas at other resorts a shuttle or a buggy are needed to get around, here you stroll along cobbled paths lined by an array of flora that would turn heads at the

Chelsea Flower Show and the Royal Botanical Gardens.



It sounds like a small aspect, but I think it makes a significant difference. I find it impossible to believe guests stay at Finca without feeling serene and losing all the tension from their mind and body. The only time you don't wander along the paths is when you go to the 6,000sq m Beach Club, located less than a mile from

the hotel. Here, you choose between sun loungers on teak wooden flooring or sun loungers on golden sand, in between dips in the 35m infinity pool.

The buildings themselves are gorgeous, but they hide a secret; I made the mistake of thinking Finca was a hotel created out of an ancient former grand family home, but the reality is it was all built this century. While the buildings are young, the materials are

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not, being brought in to give Finca a very palatial, pedigree feel. It worked. There is an avant-garde style following traditional Andalusian architecture.

The hotel is formed around two main courtyards surrounded by 23,000sq m of manicured gardens. Strolling around those gardens and through the hotel is a joy in itself; it is, as you might imagine, an Instagrammer's delight.

The kaleidoscope of colours continues on the course, where Cabell Robinson's design is enhanced by the landscaping of the revered Gerald Huggan. There are 20 varieties of flora as well as typical Mediterranean trees lining the fairways.

Robinson masterfully routed Finca over challenging, undulating terrain, using the rises and falls to his advantage, with a number of captivating tee shots and approaches.

Finca's legendary conditioning went to the next level when it became the first course in Spain to feature a new, environmentally-friendly type of Bermuda grass on all its putting surfaces. They are absolutely pure. This is a course that is Solheim Cup-ready all year round.

Before you play, you will want to hit a few balls on the memorable range, which

slopes notably downhill to give you a nice, flattering carry and ball flight before you tee off. Oh, and the service at the clubhouse is at least the match of that in the hotel.

Away from golf, you can be pampered in a spa as luxurious as you'd expect. The 2,200sq m haven boasts individual areas for facial and body treatments, massages, and thermal baths, plus Spain's first snow cave.

You might, on occasion, feel inclined to do nothing more than enjoy the comfort of your room. The 'Junior' suites are spacious (52sq m), high-ceilinged affairs with a huge bathroom with a bathtub, walk-in shower and private patio or terrace. The bed is as large as it is comfortable.

If you want non-stop action, there are four swimming pools as well as tennis and padel tennis courts on site, plus sailing, fishing, kitesurfing, windsurfing, swimming, horse riding, trekking and mountain biking. Even skiing in the Sierra Nevada can be arranged.

There is a Yoga & Meditation Centre on a hill with views of the Mediterranean too, while gym-goers are extremely well catered for, with a large room equipped with Technogym machines and blessed with stress-relieving views of the gardens. It's fair to say you will train better here than you do at home. And that's just as well, because you will also eat exceptionally well.

El Jardín de Lutz is an al fresco restaurant, where breakfast – a mix of tapas-style options and more substantial dishes – and dinner are enjoyed on a terrace featuring ancient olive trees.

REI is the hotel's signature restaurant, renowned for its traditional Asian dishes and fusions of Asian and Mediterranean influences. You can watch the renowned chef Luis Olarra artfully and expertly prepare your dishes in the kitchen.

Don Giovanni is a wonderful Italian restaurant with a wine list to match, and don't rule out The Blue Bar, in the hotel lounge and on a beautiful terrace outside. Its tapas menu is superb.

The clubhouse's restaurant terrace overlooks the range and is the perfect place after your round. You'll enjoy a cold beer and a club sandwich here.

And on those rare days when you're not playing golf, the place for lunch is the Beach Club, where a sharing paella is essential. From a table overlooking the Med and with a crisp white wine in hand, it is one of the many all-world experiences at this most idyllic bolt hole.

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In every Top 100 there is always an entry we look at and think 'that is so unlucky to be there'. This is it. PDR falls two places, but only because of Verdura's rise and even more affection for Finca Cortesin's elegance. Yet PDR could sit anywhere between

eighth and second. If you want more than one elite-level course, this is the best option in the entire list; West Cliffs is top 15 in the continent, Praia D'El Rey top 30. Nowhere else can match that.

Bill Coore designed the No.1 course, a staple in our continental top 25. His associate, Rod Whitman, added the second, the Vignes, also in our continental 100. The heathlandwoodlands headline this golf-dominated resort because, while the neat hotel has a spa, there aren't many other amenities.

La Cala made a huge jump in the 2020 list as we recognised the progress made at this Andalusian resort over the past few years. This time, no change, as we stand by our assertion two years ago that this is one of the leading resorts on the continent.

Few are as comprehensive in terms of courses, with 54 very evenly-balanced holes at La Cala: America, Europa, and Asia. All have been renovated in the last four years, giving the golf a fresh look that so many resorts would be wise to follow.

The third of the courses to open at this Andalusian 'super resort' might be its No.1.

Europa was designed by Cabell Robinson and has arguably its best nine – its second half – and arguably the best hole of the 54, the intriguing and exacting two-shot 4th. But others will think America is the best and no-one will view the Asia as anything other than an excellent 'third'. It's worth pointing out that all three courses are on site, which helps its 'Setting' mark.

The rest of its setting are undulating hills, 15 minutes from the bustle of the coast.

There is a spa that is better than most in this ranking, as well as tennis and football. The large swimming pool will appeal to many and, thanks to the climate, you can be lazing around it for as many as eight months of the year.

Another key attraction are La Cala's restaurants; La Bodega's tapas is our favourite in a very competitive field.



Courses 27 Accommodation 19 Amenities 19 Setting 18 TOTAL 83 Getting there Lisbon airport is 40 minutes away.

A significant leap into its highest position in our ranking - and there is every chance its journey will not end here. Penha Longa is a magnificent resort that ticks every box, as the marks above illustrate. It is one of the list's most rounded resorts, with no weakness.

It has a course established in the continental Top 100 as well as nine extra holes that aren't quite the same calibre, but are still absolutely worth playing. The Robert Trent Jones Jnr Atlantic course is full of drama and spectacular shots. Kyle Phillips did much of the work when he was in the RTJ stable, and that ensured this undulating property was used to its maximum.

So there are heroic downhill drives, dramatic shots over gullies and pleasing approaches to infinity greens, yet remarkably very few tedious uphill slogs. A masterful routing by one of the modern greats.

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
That is barely half the story, though. Off the course, it is in a class of only about five others. Very few resorts come close to the appeal and class of Penha Longa's hotel.

It mixes classic architecture with modern interior design and luxury comforts. It is pleasingly spacious, yet somehow everything feels well-connected. You're never more than a couple of minutes' stroll from your chosen restaurant or activity.

Talking of food, it is simply immense. The breakfast starts things off in style and for lunch you will want to head to Arola, above the golf reception, for some delicious fish or the best steak sandwich you'll ever eat. It has a terrace with a view of the 1st and 18th.

At night, Lab by Sergi Arola is a Michelinstarred restaurant with three different tasting menus and 550 wines. You can start with a brilliant culinary tour of Portugal, conducted superbly by your hosts.

The active among you will love the gym, tennis courts, football pitch and volleyball. There is also an adventure playground, even if that is possibly aimed more at your kids than you. They have their own outdoor playground including mini golf as well as an indoor kids' club with soft play area. In the summer, there's a bouncy castle to keep them occupied as you enjoy a leisurely breakfast. Penha Longa think of everything.

16 LE TOUQUET ■ LE TOUQUET, FRANCE

The Robert Trent Jones Snr design is one of Europe's finest, winding between pines as it moves to, alongside and from the sea. The turf is now more consistently good and it's a lovely place to play the game. Hotel and apartments are good. 'Setting' would score higher but for the short journey along the peninsula between the course and lodging.

MONTE REI TAVIRA, PORTUGAL Courses 31 Accommodation 18 Amenities 14 Setting 18 TOTAL 81 Getting there Faro airport is 50 mins away.

These two pages illustrate the strength of continental resorts; all are exceptionally good and there are different emphases, meaning every taste is catered for. Monte Rei's standout is its course, which is a top-15 fixture in our continental ranking. The Jack Nicklaus design is immaculately presented and a real bucket-lister. There are also now 142 rooms on site and with a notably good restaurant, this is a desirable, glamorous destination.







The highest place this Algarve resort has enjoyed in our Resorts ranking to date. Sitting in the hills above the lovely town of Armacao de Pera, there are two fine, contrasting courses, the exacting Faldo and the delightful O'Connor. There are apartments and luxury villas to stay in and amenities such as a gym, restaurant and children's playground.





22 MONTGOMERIE **MAXX ROYAL** BELEK, TURKEY

Course 27 Accommodation 19 Amenities 18 Setting 17 TOTAL 81 Getting there Antalya airport is 30 mins away.

Just look at the marks to understand the strengths of 'Monty Maxx'. The hotel is one of Belek's most dazzling - in a very competitive field. It has lots of amenities too, as per its neighbours. The course is a European Tour host and is a continental Top 100 contender.



One for a family holiday or couples, because it has one of Portugal's biggest and best hotels. If one or two in a family want somewhere where the rest won't be bored at when they're playing golf, this is ideal. The course is nice, with some waterdominated holes with a real wow factor.



35 PENINA PORTIMAO, PORTUGAL

Penina being 35th shows you how good resorts are on the continent. If it was top 20 you would not blink when you went there, you'd think it fully justified. The Algarve's original course, set among mature woodland, is more than backed up by a fantastic, large hotel where non-golfers will be very happy.



36 QUINTA DA RIA TAVIRA, PORTUGAL

Courses **30** Accommodation **17** Amenities 16 Setting 18 TOTAL 81 Getting there Faro is 25 minutes away.

We've promoted this eastern Algarve resort from our first Top 100 and maintain that it's really, really good. Two contrasting courses - the technically proficient Cima among woodland and the scenic, Med-side Ria - sit next to a nice but unfussy hotel. Perfect for a golf break where peak relaxation is key.



Much has changed here since we first produced a Top 100 Resorts list. It wasn't even in that ranking as it did not have a hotel then, and also since then the three loops of nine have been redesigned by Robert Trent Jones Jnr. The result is a resort that has 'only' 27 holes and a small-ish hotel with relatively few amenities in the top 40. That tells you how highly we rate the three nines and hotel.





37 AROEIRA LISBON, PORTUGAL

Courses 31 Accommodation 18 Amenities 15 Setting 17 TOTAL 81 **Getting there** Lisbon airport is 50 minutes away.

What a strong section of the list this is. Here's Aroeira, once 'just' two terrific pineframed courses - one in the continental Top 100, one a contender for it – but now with a delightful new hotel that opened in 2019. It's stylish and chic and although there aren't loads of amenities, the golf will satisfy you.



38 BOGOGNO MILAN, ITALY

Courses 31 Accommodation 16 Amenities 17 Setting 17 TOTAL 81 Getting there Milan Malpensa is 50 mins away.

Close to Milan Malpensa airport yet in tranquil, rolling Lombardy countryside, this is a high-class option in every way. There are two Robert von Hagge courses that are pretty much equal in quality - Top 100 contenders - plus an excellent hotel and a really good selection of non-golf amenities.



40 APHRODITE HILLS PAPHOS, CYPRUS



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Course 26 Accommodation 18 Amenities 18 Setting 18 TOTAL 80 Getting there Paphos is 20 minutes away.

Just clings on to a top-40 slot as others have improved and risen... but it remains a brilliant option. There's a course of breathtaking views, dramatic holes and even exhilarating buggy drives, plus a hotel that's popular with non-golfing families, which says it all. Look at its rounded marks.

ISTHIS EUROPE'S NEXT GREAT GOLF RESORT?

Chris Bertram returned from Umbria believing Antognolla is poised to make a huge impact in golf travel, and beyond

A ntognolla. Remember the name. It's my feeling that you won't need to try very hard though, because you will be hearing a LOT about this resort in the coming years. At the moment, it is 'just' a golf course, one good enough to be No.13 in our Italy ranking and likely to be in the 'Next 100' at least of future continental European lists. What is more certain is that it will be in the next Continental Resorts ranking. How can we be so sure? Because by the time the next ranking is compiled, Antognolla will have accommodation on site. The course is good enough to mean that the addition of a nice, modern hotel with a selection of amenities would gain it entry in the 80s or 90s in that list.



Antognolla isn't going to do that though. Antognolla is going to enter somewhere in the top 50. How can we be so sure? Because the accommodation is being created within an ancient castle on top of a hill, and will overlook the course and surrounding countryside. This is not going to be a standard golf hotel.

Our prediction is that it will fairly quickly become a magnet for influencers far outside the world of golf. Antognolla will be ALL over Instagram within a couple of years.

The fact it is in Umbria won't do it any harm, either. It remains one of Italy's best-kept secrets, but do not be surprised if it became a 'go to' destination in the same way Puglia did in the past decade.

Unlike Puglia, it is landlocked but it boasts outstanding natural beauty and oozes charm. Perugia is just 20 minutes away from Antognolla. It is Umbria's largest and most cosmopolitan city and is steeped in history and culture. It is what many of us want from a long weekend in Italy; striking, centuries-old architecture, early-evening 'aperitivo' in elegant and characterful piazzas, coffee and pastries at cute cafés on narrow, cobbled streets, and a vibe that demands you stop and smell the roses.

From a base here you can take a day trip to the World Heritage site, Assisi, the birthplace of Saint Francis, Italy's patron saint. Or head to Gubbio, one of Umbria's oldest towns, whose Gothic towers, 14th-century turrets and distinct rooftops have been painstakingly well preserved. Lago Trasimeno is Italy's fourthlargest lake and a perfect spot to unwind on a day trip that should also include the castletopped medieval towns of Castiglione del Lago and Passignano.

There is every chance you head to Antognolla in a couple of years' time and don't venture very far from the resort, and that would be understandable.

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I'm guessing at how good it will be but I find it hard to imagine that a conversion of a hilltop castle that dates back at least to the

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12th century isn't going to be utterly spectacular. It is going to combine historic, authentic Umbria with modern opulence and sumptuous comfort.

The castle – soon to be the hotel – lies at the heart of a 500-hectare estate and overlooks the Robert Trent Jones Jnr course. The course may end up being overshadowed by the hotel – frankly, it's my prediction that few courses wouldn't be – but don't think for a second it will let the side down.

It rises and falls over undulating terrain, meaning no two holes are the same. Sometimes you are firing down a hill from an elevated tee, sometimes you are playing alongside a beautiful water hazard or cliffs at the floor of a valley, sometimes you are firing across a ravine to a fairway or green. It rewards the shot-maker, but is playable for all. Good players will relish the challenge, higher handicappers will adore the setting among the forest-covered hills and the thrilling holes. One hole doesn't currently work, even if its aesthetic value – an epic infinity green – means you can understand why it was created. It'll be redesigned for next year, and will be a cracker.

You can expect a course that is wonderfully presented when you go, too. Its large, undulating greens and bunkers were subject to huge investment in 2018, with new irrigation and drainage systems also installed. "I can say without reservation that the greens are some of the finest you'll see here in Italy and the views from the course are simply spectacular," said Gary Player after he paid a visit.

A new driving range and 7.5km of buggy paths were completed in 2019. It is walkable, but many will prefer a buggy. At times I was grateful for it when I played, but when I return in 2024 to assess the hotel (I know, it's a tough job!), I will try walking the course.

By then, I am anticipating a queue of Insta influencers fighting for a slice of Antognolla. Remember where you heard about it first...

TWO MORE TO COME INTO THE 2024 LIST?

These Spanish and Bulgarian resorts will be contenders next time...



La Hacienda Alcaidesa Links

Formerly known as Alcaidesa, this resort in Andalucia has signed a deal with Fairmont Hotel & Residences to open a hotel and villa complex. There will be a soft launch in the next 12 months and it will be fully open by Easter, 2024. The 323-room hotel and villas will complete the multi-million pound investment in the resort, with La Hacienda's redesigned Links course having reopened this summer.

Okol Lake Park

This resort, 20 miles south-east of Sofia, will feature a championship course designed by Robin Hiseman, of European Golf Design, and managed by IMG, as well as a five-star, 149-room Pullman hotel and branded residences managed by Accor. There will be a luxury spa, extensive event facilities and an array of residential opportunities. It's also 15 miles from Borovets, one of Bulgaria's largest ski resorts. "The scenery and the magnificent panoramic views are the course's most spectacular features," says Hiseman.





41 CASTELFALFI FLORENCE, ITALY

Courses 25 Accommodation 18 Amenities 18 Setting 19 TOTAL80 Getting there Fly to Florence or Pisa.

Entered the top 50 for the first time in 2020 and keeps on climbing, the panel impressed by the entertaining and scenic course, the extra nine holes, and especially the two accommodation options. Plenty of other amenities in a resort within an authentic Tuscan village. Exceptional for couples.



43 CHATEAU DES VIGIERS **4**3 BORDEAUX, FRANCE

Courses 27 Accommodation 18 Amenities 17 Setting 17 TOTAL 79 Getting there Bordeaux 50 mins, Bergerac 15.

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One of the most convenient and classy breaks in the list.
